CPL KUTTNER COVE TALK - 30 MAY 18

DISCUSSION POINTS

The objective of this discussion is to allow participants to reconsider the importance of teaching/instructing, and the relationship between teaching and leading.

Questions

Some possible answers to these questions are provided in italics.

- 1. What are the benefits of the instructors in our training centres and training establishments:
 - a. To the individual? Improved self-confidence, opportunity to become expert, helping others, opportunity for advanced instructor skills, a different work-life balance, shaping the soldiers that we all work with.
 - b. To the Army? Economy of effort, development of expertise, standardisation across units, a future focus rather than a short-term focus.
- 2. Earlier this year, COMD FORCOMD indicated that we should be working towards a 'leader as a teacher' model. What do you think this means? *Every leader has a responsibility to teach their subordinates. Teaching is not just the responsibility of those posted to an instructional position. Instructors in our training centres and training establishments also have a leadership responsibility.*
- 3. Is there a difference between leading and instructing? If yes, what is the difference? It might be about your posted position. Instructing could be seen as 'one-directional' from the instructor to the trainee rather than the two-way relationship that leadership is. Instructing could be interpreted as delivering a lesson based on the 'blueprint'. Alternatively, the view could be that both leaders and instructors perform both roles they both teach and they both lead.
- 4. Is it harder to teach while occupying a leadership position in a unit?
- 5. During his presentation CPL Kuttner discusses the similarities between our units and training centres, and the units and training establishments he visited during his trip. Is this a useful thing to know? What could we do to enhance this 'cross-Army' knowledge and understanding?

Reflection

An important part of learning is self-reflection. Consider asking the participants to think about one or all of the questions below, and identify what they might change about their approach to leadership as a result. This is a personal process, so mandatory sharing of the results of this reflection is not recommended.

- Do I want to compete for an instructional posting in the future? Why or why not?
- What instructional techniques could be useful in my day-to-day role in a unit?
- What leadership considerations could be useful when I'm tasked with instructional tasks?
