



In an era of accelerated warfare, we have greater rates of change, more uncertainty and a greater span of tasks to meet. Developing the moral and intellectual component of fighting power will give us a competitive advantage because of our ability to learn, integrate and apply knowledge faster than our adversaries. One way we gain this intellectual edge is through professional development and an organisational culture that values continuous learning. Cove+ is one of the tools we can use to gain this competitive edge.

## What is Cove+?

Cove+ is a suite of professional military education courses that allows our people to evolve intellectually and morally within the profession of arms. Cove+, available on ADELE (O:S), is a broad offering of online learning units across 5 key areas:

- 1. The Art and Science of Thinking
- 2. The Art and Science of War
- 3. Leadership, Ethics & Society
- 4. Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics (STEM)
- 5. Organisational Management, People and Projects.

Cove+ units have been developed in partnership with the Queensland University of Technology to ensure learning is credible, current and challenging. Units have been carefully selected to ensure relevancy to your professional context and provide a targeted means to enhance your appreciation of the military profession.






Cove+ is open to anyone with a DPN logon. Units vary in length to complete and use a range of media for an engaging learning experience. As a self-paced program, users can engage anytime, anywhere, at no cost. A list of available units is detailed below.

### **Receive civilian accreditation for completing Cove+ modules**

Receive civilian accredited digital badges from the Queensland University of Technology for completing Cove+ modules. These badges are universally recognised by civilian employers, so the work you put into your modules can be acknowledged and seen as a transferable skill outside of the military. The badges contain metadata that describes the badge the competencies you achieved during your learning. You can share the digital badges to LinkedIn, twitter, personal résumés and email signature blocks. See the example below of a Cove+ module badge.





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
### How to use Cove+

The flexible nature of Cove+ means that units can be completed in any order. You have discretion to deep-dive into topics of interest, or select elements within a unit that are applicable to your current or future roles. You may wish to focus on one area of study for a **depth** of understanding in a particular field. Alternatively, select units from a number of different learning areas to expand your **breadth** of understanding of interconnected ideas. See an example of how to achieve this with the learning areas and units available in the table below.

Although the flexible nature of the program is part of its appeal, it is recommended you schedule a dedicated time block each week to completing Cove+ units. **Routine engagement is shown to improve focus, retention and accomplishment.**

**Reflective practice**: Reflective practice is a foundational skill upon which all learning should occur. Reflection gives you an opportunity to pause, sort through information and experiences and create new meaning. Because of the importance for reflection to learning, we have a dedicated Reflective Practice unit within the program. Reflection activities are also present in all Cove+ units. The Cove+ program is also supported by our Reflective Journal App (available on iOS and Android), or hardcopies can be sourced from your local Army Education Centre. These resources were developed to assist you to create a habit of reflective practice. You may be surprised at how reflective practice changes your perceptions, attitudes and behaviours in all manner of circumstances.
