

Colonel Mal Brick joined the Army in 1988, attending ADFA prior to graduating from Duntroon into the Royal Australian Corps of Transport.

He had a broad range of postings as a junior officer, including the Army Maritime School, 176 Air Dispatch Squadron, the Joint Movement Group and 26 Transport Squadron.

As a Major he was the OC of the Army Component at AMTDU and following attendance at ACSC was fortunate enough to gain a second sub-unit command as OC 26 Transport Squadron.

On promotion to Lieutenant Colonel he was an Instructor at ACSC. This was followed by key logistic roles within Army Headquarters and Forces Command, and as the Commanding Officer of the Army School of Logistic Operations.

Colonel Brick took command of the Defence National Storage and Distribution Centre in January 2014 following his promotion to Colonel. Over the following two years he closed the unit and established Joint Logistics Unit (East), in the process relocating more than 23 Million items of inventory to the new facility. This role was followed by his appointment as Director of Logistics – Army where he was responsible for the management of Army's \$1.6B sustainment budget whilst implementing change following the First Principles Review.

His final posting in the ARA was as the Director Land Sustainment within Land Systems Division, CASG. He transitioned to the Army Reserve in February 2021.

Colonel Brick is a graduate of the Defence Strategic Studies Course and has an MBA from Deakin University and a BA from UNSW.
